Local Development Framework (LDF) Core Strategy — Proposed Changes to Housing Disrtibution

Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC) received over 1,100 comments on its recent consultation. It therefore decided to postpone its originally proposed meetings in December and January in order to have more time to fully assess these comments. SCDC has also decided to submit the draft Core Strategy to one of its Scrutiny Committees. SCDC has published a new timetable of meetings:

- Thursday 21st January: Community, Customers & Partners Scrutiny Committee
- Wednesday 10th February: Cabinet
- Monday 8th March: Full Council

The venue is Trinity Park Showground, starting at 7 pm. All meetings are open to the public. For further information refer to www.suffolkcoastal.gov.uk

The Parish Council believes that the BT planning application has had an undue influence on the SCDC preferred option for housing distribution and is strongly objecting to 2,000 new homes in our area.

Boundary Committee advice to the Secretary of State on unitary local government in Suffolk

On 7th December the Boundary Committee for England published its

advice and now the Secretary of State has to take a decision on whether to:

- implement the original lpswich Borough Council proposal in 2007, with or without modification;
- implement one of the Committee's alternative proposals: a unitary county of Suffolk (Committee's preferred alternative) or a two-unitary pattern comprising an Ipswich & Felixstowe authority and a Rural Suffolk authority;
- take no action.

Anyone who wishes to make representations to the Secretary of State should do so by 19th January, in writing to: SuffolkStructures@communities.gsi.gov.uk or Unitary Structures Team, Zone 3/J1, Eland House, Bressenden Place, London, SW1E 5DU. After last month's newsletter went to press we got late notice that Suffolk Coastal District Council had decided to postpone the LDF task force meeting which had been scheduled for 14th December.

We hope you heard about this and didn't turn up at Trinity Park to find it dark! We asked SCDC to try and inform everyone - they issued a press release and emailed everyone who had responded to their consultation. NANT e-mailed as many people as possible including everyone who had given us their e-mail address in response to our online survey.

The new schedule of meetings is now as follows (all at Trinity Park at 7pm):-

*21st January — Community, Customers & Partners Scrutiny Committee

*10th February — Cabinet *8th March — Full Council

Please do try to attend these meetings — a good turn out will show the strength of feeling in the community. Our councillors will know that their discussions have been widely observed, and that we are not just relying on the published minutes to know what was said.

SCDC's website says:"We would like to thank all those who took the time to respond to the latest consultation about where the new homes needed in the district would be distributed between now and 2025.

Because over 1,100 individual comments were received, we have decided that we need more time to fully assess them and have post-poned our scheduled meetings about the Core Strategy......It has been decided to submit the draft Core Strategy to one of the Council's Scrutiny Committees whose role is to examine proposals as part of the Council's wider policy framework."

We hope this is good news and that SCDC will listen to every-

one's real concerns about an LDF consultation process that originally specified 1050 houses and is now proposing 2000 houses with the potential to grow up to 3500 homes.

NANT is currently trying to find out the precise terms of reference of the Scrutiny Committee to see whether or not we can have a direct input.

Thanks to the 300+ people who responded to our survey and to everyone who submitted their comments to SCDC — we know it wasn't an easy process but hopefully it will prove to have been worth doing if the council listen to us all
