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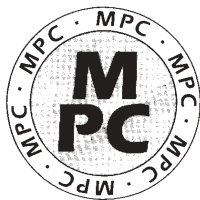
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## MARTLESHAM PARISH COUNCIL

### Vacancies for two Parish Councillors

There are two vacancies for Parish Councillors and they provide an opportunity for someone to help and contribute to the Martlesham community

The role of a parish councillor is varied and interesting as it involves many aspects of the community; it is a voluntary position involving usually only two meetings per month and the amount of any other time needed is as little or as much as you may wish to make of the role. If you are interested in helping to improve your community, perhaps you disagree with some of the things that the parish council does, or maybe you feel that your part of the parish needs better representation, please contact the Clerk who can provide further details or speak to any councillor.

One vacancy can be filled by co-option at the Parish Council Meeting but the second vacancy is being advertised (on the parish notice boards) to see if an election is wanted; if no election is called then this vacancy can also be filled by co-option

### Parish Plan

The Parish Council has agreed to proceed with a Parish Plan and consider setting up a steering committee to coordinate the work. The purpose of the plan is to consult with all residents to find out what are their views, concerns, needs and aspirations regarding all aspects of our community. We can then work to plan to fulfill or resolve these as much as we are able and try to further improve the community and its facilities. The plan will also be very useful in our liaison with and consultations from the district and county councils and other agencies.

### Park and Ride

A planning application for the Park and Ride site is expected towards the end of July and we have been told that there will be a consultation period of 16 weeks. That should give sufficient time to

seek parishioners' views and make a proper response; please keep a look out for further details in the Monthly and/or on the notice boards. If you have any comments please let the Clerk know, preferably in writing or by e-mail.

### Drunken disorder in The Square and on The Green

Following recent incidents of the above we have been asked about the possibility of an alcohol ban on both The Square and The Green. To obtain such a ban will involve the police, Suffolk Coastal District Council, MCL (as "owners" of The Green) and Bidwells (as agents for the owners of The Square) as well the Parish Council and could take some time. What are your views? Please let the Clerk know.

### Overhanging Branches

Many footways and pathways have low overhanging branches or encroaching shrubs which are a nuisance to pedestrians and could cause injuries. Please check your own frontage and trim any branches so that there is plenty of headroom underneath and the path has its proper width. You could be liable for any injury caused by a branch that is too low!

**MARTLESHAM HEATH SURGERY**

Unfortunately, once again we are experiencing difficulty in recruiting doctors at the surgery. Dr Tom Young left the Practice at the end of June and we had appointed a new doctor to start at the end of August. She has now been accepted on a further training course and is not able to come to work with us. We have been trying to get locum cover but, with the holiday season fast approaching, this is proving to be most difficult.

We would like to suggest that you do not see a doctor if you only want a repeat prescription, but simply put your repeat request through the letter box. If the doctor feels that you should be seen before giving you another prescription, then we will contact you.

We would also like to suggest that, if you are wanting to query a referral to a hospital, in the first instance you should contact the secretary of the Consultant to whom you have been referred at the hospital.

Hopefully, by adopting the above

strategy doctors' appointments will be left for clinical problems with which only the doctor can deal.

May we stress once again that we need 48 hours to process repeat prescriptions or hospital admission forms and that it is very difficult for us to do them in less time, as it can lead to errors when they are rushed.

Thank you all for your patience and co-operation and be assured that we will do our best to fulfil our commitment to our patients.

On Tuesday 18th the Group had its AGM during which we recruited a couple of new committee members, which is great. However if anyone else thinks they would like to help the group by being on the committee more members are always welcome. Similarly, with the hope of getting the Scout Troop up and running again, anyone interested in leading or assisting Scouts please speak to any of the leaders or committee members for more information.

### **PORTAL AVENUE WOODLANDS MANAGEMENT/CONSERVATION GROUP**

The Group have been quietly working away over the past three months and would like to thank those volunteers who have turned out to help. Machinery has been in hibernation while the wildlife has its spring flutter, and the machinery receives its rest and servicing. However, we have been refurbishing one of the WW1 1 revetments that has been vandalised, preventing bracken, bramble and nettles from taking over two open areas, planting trees and wildflowers and applying TLC to our 60 metres of hedge planted last autumn. One problem we have encountered with the hedge is that the spiral tree guards used to guard against rabbits etc are no deterrent to the Muntjak and Fallow deer who use the Woodland. We have replaced 50 spiral guards with plastic shelters courtesy of SCDC, but need another 70 to complete the task. A source of second hand shelters is being rapidly investigated before the deer do too much damage! (Any suggestions apart from shotguns at dawn and then a barbecue are welcome).

As soon as the wildlife mating season is finished we shall be back to tree thinning, habitat creation, and path improvement as well as

continuing with the other tasks. To this end other volunteers are always required and contact numbers for volunteers are given below.

The one current downside is that our phantom tree puller is still operating, and occasionally people backing onto the woodland in Deben Avenue are still dumping waste, although they are making sure it is not obvious from where it comes. Any information on these illegal activities will be gratefully received.

The next working days are 10 to 12noon on the 21st of July and the 14th of September. As normal we will meet on the perimeter track at the entrance to the Force HQ sports field. We will also have a display at 'Music on the Green' on the 13th of July in Martlesham Heath.

This month our demonstration was given by one of our Members, Ruth Mellen, and her friend Irene Packard. The theme was a "June Wedding" showing traditional and modern arrangements. To set the scene Irene began with a pedestal for church or reception. Using contrasting foliage such as aspidistra and fatsia, choysya and eucalyptus together with carnations, alstroemera and stocks a lovely arrangement in traditional pink and white was created. Ruth gave us an amusing commentary drawing on her florist training and her experience of "doing" the flowers for various events. Next came a modern bride's bouquet of orange cream gerbera, lily buds with fern and roses. Far different from the heavily wired bouquet we members carried at our weddings.

A large triple placement was shown next. This was done in shades of pale orange and cream, again using lilies, roses and gerberas following the modern colour scheme. A useful tip was given to make fatsia and aspidistra shine (useful in competition work).

Then it was our turn. Some members elected to try their hands at making a corsage. Helped by Ruth and Irene everyone managed a very presentable result. Great fun was had by all. To end the demonstration Irene made a small basket suitable for a child to carry from spider chrysanthemums and carnations complete with foliage.
