# MESSAGE FROM EASTERN **AREA POLICE COMMANDER**

The recent and ongoing events within Ipswich and the surrounding area have been a shock, I am sure, to all our communities in Suffolk and a stark reminder that, whilst we live in one of the safest counties in the country, we are not immune on occasions to the most serious of crimes.

Murders such as these are. fortunately, very rare and I can assure you that Suffolk Constabulary and all its staff are doing everything within our power to protect the public and to catch the person, or persons, responsible.

Increased high-visibility patrols are being carried out within Ipswich, and in Suffolk Coastal we will be providing additional patrols to provide reassurance to those who live, work or visit the area.

With regard to personal safety, we are at this time advising women to take additional safety precautions when aging out at night, particularly to avoid being on their own if at all possible. Whilst this applies particularly to Ipswich and the red-light district it is at this extraordinary time good advice for anyone living in Suffolk Coastal.

On a separate but related note I would like to take the opportunity to remind you of a new service being offered by Suffolk Constabulary. Police Direct is free and allows the Police to communicate directly with the public via text, e-mail or voice messaging, in order to give immediate information. Whilst this service may be of some use during this difficult time, being signed up will have longer-term benefits in keeping you updated on what is happening in your area in relation to crime. # NEW SIXTH FORM FACILITIES AT KESGRAVE HIGH SCHOOL

Many readers of the local community magazines are probably unaware that places for Sixth Form pupils at Kesgrave are at a premium. The expansion of the 11 to 16 school, there are now 280 in each year group, will inevitably mean that there will be increased demand for places, exceeding the number of spaces available. This would have the effect of reducing post-16 opportunities in the locality.

Over the last eight months the school has been in consultation with the LSC (Learning & Skills Council). The school's objective has been to secure funding for a further building programme to ensure post-16 access to school-based education could be maintained for an increased number of pupils in the school's catchment area.

We have now received the exciting news that a grant directly from the Learning Skills Council to the school is to be made in the new financial year. This is believed to be the first grant the Council has made specifically to a school. The Local Authority has been very supportive of our plans and is currently working with the school in the design and building of the new facility. Subject to consultations, and the due planning process, it is

hoped to begin initial work on the site in April next year.

Further information about the project will be shared with the local community and the parent body through the community magazines and the school's HIGHlights publication.

# MARTLESHAM HEATH AVIATION SOCIETY

Our monthly meeting on December 1st featured one of our own

members. Mr Harry Watson joined the RAF in 1952 and retired as a Flight Lieutenant in 1977 after an eventful career.

Harry was a navigator and his illustrated talk was mainly about his time in Borneo and Malaya flying the Scottish Aviation Twin Pioneer. A video of the Twin Pioneer was shown and this was followed by a slide show of images taken by Harry Watson at the time.

The Twin Pioneer was an interesting aeroplane which was designed for both civil and military use. It had an extremely short take off and landing capability making it particularly useful on the type of temporary, short runways encountered in wartime conditions. It had a crew of two, consisting of pilot and navigator and could carry up to 13 troops. It was powered by two Alvis Leonides radial engines.

Harry's time in Borneo and Malaya was during the communist bid for supremacy in that region and the stories of his experiences under battle conditions were most interesting.

A vote of thanks was given by Alan Smith.

Our next meeting will be on Friday 5th January and the talk will be given by Alan Smith. His illustrated talk is entitled, 'The Development of the Air Sea Rescue Service in World War 2', tracing the development from the earliest days to the end of World War 2, with special reference to the part played by RAF Martlesham Heath. Some fascinating stories will be told on the way!

# MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP

Following on from last month's feature on garden bird recording, did you notice fewer birds in your garden last autumn? Well, as you may have surmised, this was due to good crops of fruit and certain seeds in the wider countryside. Whilst such "natural" food availability normally creates an autumn dip in the reporting rates for many species, the BTO has said that autumn 2006 rates were particularly notable, demonstrating a greater harvest than usual. Of course, this larder won't last forever and with cold weather most likely this month, we should see an increased reliance on garden feeding stations.

Having written last month about the BTO/CJ Garden Birdwatch Project which operates all year round, this month on 27th-28th January, you can take part in the 28th annual RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch. If you have not been involved before, all you have to do is put aside one hour that weekend and write down the highest number of each species that you see at one time.
