#### **Parish Council Appointments**

At our Annual Parish Council meeting on 5th May the following appointments were made:

Chairman of the Parish Council – Colin Moore; Vice-Chairman – Wally Welch; Chair of Development Plans Committee – Leo Brome; Chair of Finance & General Purposes Committee – Wally Welch; Chair of Recreation & Amenities Committee – Duncan Sweeting.

Wally Welch has worked hard as Chairman for the Council during the past 5 years and the Council wishes to express its thanks for all he has done and achieved on behalf of the parish. He continues in a supportive role to the new Chairman for this year. The Council also thanks Chris Blundell for his work as Chairman of the Development Plans Committee which unfortunately he had to give up earlier this year but he does continue as a council member.

#### **Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC) Local Development Framework (LDF) Core Strategy/BT Planning Application**

SCDC informed us that as a result of their Council meeting on 18th March 2010, the Core Strategy and Development Management

Policies have been adopted as “interim planning policy for the determining of planning applications and enforcement”. During May SCDC gave us the opportunity to comment further on the BT planning application in light of the new interim planning policy. The Parish Council has strongly restated its key reasons for objecting but has also outlined conditions and mitigation action required if SCDC nonetheless goes ahead and grants outline planning permission. It is likely that the District Council will determine the application in the coming months but as yet we have no confirmed dates/deadlines.

The interim policies will remain in force until the Core Strategy has been through an Examination in Public in front of an independent inspector, likely to take place around February time 2011. Before that there will be a further round of consultation commencing in June 2010 for 8 weeks. This will be specifically on the “soundness” of the document, i.e. whether the proposals are justified, effective and consistent with national policy. I have recently been advised that the public consultation exercise into the soundness of the Suffolk Coastal LDF will be taking place during June and July for a six to eight week period. All responses to this process will be forwarded to the Government Planning Inspector who will be holding the examination in public sometime in the New Year. **RAISING IN MEMORY OF MY DAD, IAN BEATTIE**

I get married in July and my dad, Ian, won't be there to walk me down the aisle. He died June 18th 2005, the day before father's day, aged 53, and I will be running this year's Race for Life in his memory.

Ian lived on Martlesham Heath for most of the 80's and was involved in founding the local Youth Club, youth football and had used to enjoy playing cricket. I have a memory of him putting tiles on the pavilion roof back when it was first built (he didn't like heights much.)

Dad had suffered with poor health for many years and was hoping to get a heart and lung transplant which would have given him an extra 10 years and a much better quality of life.

Unfortunately, in April 2005, he was diagnosed with a terminal brain tumour, which meant he could no longer be considered for a heart and lung transplant. He was given 6 months to live. In the end his lungs gave up before the tumour got him.

My mum will walk me down the aisle and my uncle is going to make the speech his brother should have made. Waterproof mascara required, I think...and that's just for Uncle Bert.

### **MARTLESHAM CONSERVATION GROUP**

As we move through June we should see the emergence of the adult Silver Studded Blue butterflies on our heathland. This butterfly is very characteristic of heathland relying on heather as the larval food plant and having complex relationships involving ants, which nurture the larva and pupa, with the adults emerging from ant colonies. The weather this year has been so much colder for longer and it will be interesting to see when the first Silver Studded Blues emerge, as well as the effect on the population.

We will aim to count the numbers of adults towards the end of June possibly on a Saturday or Sunday if the weather is suitable. Please contact me directly if you are interested in helping with the count on the site of special scientific interest.

on the western corridor heath site of special scientific interest on Sunday 13th June. Please meet outside the Douglas Bader at 10 am or join us on the heath.

### **KESGRAVE & DISTRICT SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD TEAM**

#### **Spare a thought!**

Firstly, let me introduce myself. I am Mike Sarbutts and I am a Police Community Support Officer, based at the Kesgrave & District Safer Neighbourhood Team.

The subject of my first newsletter is Anti-Social Behaviour (known in short as ASB). Choosing ASB as the subject was easy, firstly because it's something that is reported to us quite often, and secondly, one such incident can affect dozens of people.

So what is ASB? It is basically any action that causes alarm, harassment or distress to someone else. It can be in many forms, but frequently it is groups of youths being too noisy and generally showing a lack of thought for the rest of the community.

People have a right to a peaceful life. They rightly expect that everyone will respect that and it's naturally very upsetting when that respect is not shown. It may just be a group of youths meeting at the bus stop because they feel there is nothing to do or anywhere else to go. Sadly, it sometimes results in shouting, screaming, littering and, unfortunately, it sometimes escalates into criminal damage or even theft.

When those involved in ASB get home, they do not give a second thought about how the victim is feeling. While the perpetrator closes their curtains, the victim is peering out from behind theirs in fear that they will return. When the perpetrator goes to sleep, the victim lies awake worrying. The next morning the perpetrator gets up having forgotten about the night before, and the victim gets up thinking about nothing else.

So, I am making a request to anyone who finds themselves at a 'loose end' and resorts to behaving in a manner that could be described as Anti-Social. Please spare a thought for those around you and

try to imagine the fear and worry that your actions may lead to in the community. You are fortunate that you do not see the effects that ASB has on people – sadly we see it too often and, while it's over in a split second for you, it can be weeks of stress and worry to your victims. So please keep the noise down and remember that some people go to bed many hours before you do.

It seems that sometimes those committing ASB have no idea that they have even committed it. When you think about it, it's actually something that's very easy to become involved in if you do not consider the wider community in your actions. If you do become involved in it, then it will be no surprise that we will become involved in dealing with it and you.

Finally, let me also make an appeal to parents. Do you know where your children are in the evenings? Do you know who they associate with and what they do? Is it possible that they may become involved in any Anti-Social Behaviour? It may well be worth you asking your children these questions before we have to, because the any waves made are more than capable of reaching your doorstep and beyond too.

I hope that this message gets across to all age groups in the community, and lets hope that we can all enjoy a pleasant and peaceful summer.

### **"Can't see for Dust!!"**

They paraded their fasting, their gifts at the temple and their scrupulous ceremonial cleansing, yet objected when Jesus healed on the sabbath day! 'Blind leaders of the blind', Jesus called them.

It is possible, of course, for any one of us to get 'dust' in our eyes, often from inner selfishness and pride. Some are blinded to the Glory of God in creation and say that everything came out of 'chaos'. Do you see 'chaos' in the life of a rose? Or the beauty of a butterfly? There's none so blind as those who won't see!!
