**Bloor Homes Planning
Application, Martlesham
Development Plans Committee
meeting on Thursday 9th September, 7:30 pm, Parish Room, Felixstowe Road**

Bloor Homes have submitted the following planning application to Suffolk Coastal District Council (SCDC): C10/1906 – Land south of Main Road, Martlesham – Erection of 281 dwellings together with associated garages, parking access off Main Road and open space.

SCDC has set a target date for making a decision on this application of 25th October 2010 (this may be subject to change). Along with the BT planning application for 2,000 homes on the land south of Adastral Park, which remains undetermined, this application is highly contentious. The Parish Council is therefore calling the meeting above to discuss this issue alone. SCDC has offered to send 2 planning officers along to advise and answer questions.

As with all planning applications, this Council is only a consultee. SCDC will make the decision and therefore we urge parishioners to make their comments known direct to SCDC by writing to Mr P J Ridley, Head of Planning Services, Suffolk Coastal District Council, Melton Hill, Woodbridge, IP12 1AU or e-mailing d.c.admin@suffolkcoastal.gov.uk, but please submit a copy to us.

Many people have been concerned by the minimum statutory

period for response given by SCDC. They have therefore extended their deadline to **Friday 24th September 2010**.

The planning application is available to view by appointment in the Parish Room. Please contact the Clerk as below.

Projects and Grants

The Parish Council will be considering all applications for grants from local organisations in the autumn. If your group wishes to apply for a grant, please contact the Clerk (details below) for an application form, to be completed and returned to the Parish Council by **Monday 18th October 2010**. These grants are awarded for the financial year 2011/12 and the funds will be issued in May 2011. Please note that due to a change in Parish Council meetings the deadline for grants is now earlier than in previous years.

SO WHAT DOES OUR PARISH COUNCIL DO FOR US?

I wonder how many of you reading this piece know what a parish council does, how much it costs you, the council tax payer, to run, what powers it has and what value it adds to your environment in these difficult times?

This is the first of five monthly articles which will provide the answers to the questions above and ultimately seeks to provide enough information for you to judge if your money is well spent and ultimately to consider whether **you** wish to stand for election to the council in May next year.

The parish of Martlesham covers both (old) Martlesham and Martlesham Heath residents. There are 15 parish councillors who are unpaid, care greatly for the area in which they live, and seek to influence District, County and ultimately Government thinking to achieve the wishes of the parishioners of this semi-rural parish. They also have local stewardship responsibilities in relation to local amenities such as play spaces, footpaths and cycle routes and are consulted in relation to planning matters.

The Parish Council meets on 10 occasions in the year – on the first Wednesday in the month excluding August and December. There are three committees reporting to the full council. They are: Development Plans; Recreation &

Amenities; and Finance & General Purposes. The committees also have working groups, set up as necessary. The councillors are supported by the Clerk, her deputy and an administrative assistant, all part time staff with a depth of knowledge and experience to ensure that the councillors conduct their business in an efficient and correct fashion.

Over the next three months the Chairman of each of the committees will give an outline of the work they do and for the final piece the Parish Council Chairman will pull all of the detail together and invite you to consider joining the team.

Incidentally did you know that Martlesham Parish Council has recently been reaccredited with Quality Parish Status? Not an award that will be obvious to many except for the logo QPS which appears on Parish Council documents. However it is a matter for much satisfaction to your parish council and congratulations are due to the Clerk, her team and those councillors who pulled the evidence required together and submitted many documents for scrutiny by the awarding panel.

CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

First may I say a big thank you to all those who responded to my request for information on the owner-

ship and management of the area known as Walk Farm Woods/Dr Brittain's Woods. Working together with the Martlesham Parish Council we hope to eventually resolve some if not all of the problems associated with this woodland. I will report on this when more progress has been made.

Second, I believe that you may like to know something of the strenuous efforts that SCDC is making to keep district council costs down through more efficiency. The main efficiency comes about by sharing a large portion of our essential costs with our neighbourhood councils. For example, significant savings have been made by sharing the services of our Chief Executive and Head of Planning with Waveney DC, and also our IT services. Other savings have come about through such items as combined insurance premiums with other councils around us. In all with these kinds of shared activities we managed to reduce our costs in the 2009/2010 financial year by almost £200,000. Some reorganization also helped to reduce costs still further.

Finally there is the matter of a new planning application that, if passed, will have a significant impact on Martlesham. I refer to the application submitted by Bloor Homes (C10/1906) for 281 new homes on the land known locally as 'Mr Pipe's Field' off Main Road. This is a completely separate application to that submitted by BT. I invite all readers to read carefully the notes issued by the Martlesham Parish Council. JOHN KELSO'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

**Planning application Mr Pipe's Field and Mill Farm
(The field opposite The Black Tiles adjacent to the Common to Felix-**

stowe Road)

A planning application has now been received by Suffolk Coastal's planning department from Bloor Homes to build 281 new homes on Mr Pipe's Field, Main Road and at Mill Farm, Felixstowe Road. The plans are available to view either at the District Council offices at Melton Hill, Woodridge or at the Martlesham Parish Council office, Felixstowe Road by prior arrangement with the Parish Clerk 01473 612632.

Anyone who wishes to make representations to Suffolk Coastal can still do so via e-mail to d.c.admin@suffolkcoastal.gov.uk or in writing to Head of Planning, Suffolk Coastal District Council, Melton Hill, Woodridge, IP12 1AU. Please quote the following planning application reference number 10/1906. It is vital that you get your opinions heard. The Parish Council will be holding a Development Plans Committee meeting at the Parish Room on Thursday 9th September at 7:30 pm to discuss this planning application.

Suffolk Coastal's Local Development Framework update

The Coalition Government has now clearly stated that the housing figures produced by the regional authority and that have been used by Suffolk Coastal to produce its LDF Core Strategy, and to justify the building of 2,000 homes at and around Adastral Park, are no longer binding on Local Authorities. Suffolk Coastal, if they so wish, could now decide to review its housing needs within its Core Strategy.

The Government's strongly expressed view on the matter is that the regional analysis of need, demand, and broad location of new housing should be replaced by a local bottom up analysis. This opinion is something I strongly support and is something that Suffolk Coastal's Cabinet member with responsibility for planning, Andy

Smith, has been asking for some-time.

Councillor Smith says, "Our task now is to review the strategic housing land aspects of the Core Strategy in line with this new approach. That is to say we have to find ways of identifying need and demand for housing according to local circumstances, both District wide and for individual communities, probably specifically for towns and the larger villages, and more generically for the smaller villages."

He goes on to say, "The Planning Policy Team are currently working to identify ways of doing that, and what factors need to be taken into account, and hence the relevant statistics, estimates and trends and so on which need to be researched from various sources. Some of this was done around 2003-2006, to feed into the Regional Spatial Strategy process, but we now need to update that work, and we now have more freedom to use whatever additional criteria are relevant to our own circumstances."

The advice from Government is that Local Authorities may wish to review their plans following the revocation of Regional Strategies and it recommends that reviews should be undertaken as quickly as possible. I look forward to prompt action being taken by Suffolk Coastal.

NANT UPDATE

Did you know?

NANT stands for 'No Adastral New Town'. Our mission is to protect the quality of life and the environment of local communities in the areas likely to be affected by BT's proposed housing development next to Adastral Park.

Where will the New Town be?

The new development will be located on the other side of the A12 from Martlesham Heath Village, starting at the side of the BT complex and stretching out towards Waldringfield.

Planning permission is being sought for -

- 2000 dwellings (flats and houses) plus 60,000 sq m of additional employment floor space, a hotel, medical facilities, primary and secondary schools and shops.

- Removal of the A12 roundabouts at Tesco, BT and Foxhall Road and replacing them with multi-lane traffic light junctions.

What effect will this have?

Martlesham and Martlesham Heath could lose their village-like character, becoming part of a much larger town or suburb of Ipswich.

The significant increase in population (about 5000 people) will affect road access to neighbouring villages (e.g. Waldringfield, Newbourne, Bucklesham) and have a highly detrimental effect on the internationally protected wildlife sites along the Deben Estuary, Newbourne Springs, etc.

Additional infrastructure such as the new secondary school, increased energy capacity and water treatment will make further housing development in this general area more viable and possibly inevitable.

Local traffic levels and noise plus congestion on the A12 and A14 via the Orwell Bridge will rise significantly.

House prices in the neighbouring area are likely to drop.

What about Bloor's planning application in old Martlesham?

A lot of NANT's arguments apply equally to other development in this area, such as the recent planning application by Bloor Homes to build 281 houses in old Martlesham.

What is happening now?

Outline planning permission has been sought by BT and is currently awaiting a decision by Suffolk Coastal District Council. In the meantime, the Council has not finalised its planning policy (the Local Development Framework) for the District.

What does NANT want?

NANT is asking the Council to conduct a proper and thorough review of local housing needs before taking any further steps. They should not take decisions that will affect

the District for all time based on pressure (perceived or real) by developers.

MARTLESHAM HEATH HOUSEHOLDERS LTD

MHHL, Martlesham Conservation Group and Natural England held a very successful public meeting on 5th August to discuss the future of the Western Corridor Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). Thank you to all those residents who took the time to come along and ask some very interesting questions. Thanks also to Phil Smith of the Conservation Group who presented the facts to the audience and answered many of the questions. Peter See, a MHHL Director, also came along to talk to the Natural England representative about setting up a Charitable Trust to fund the work needed. He is still actively looking for more help from householders to run this Trust – if you are interested you can get in touch in the usual ways (below) but ask specifically for Peter.

MHHL is to remove the lower branches of some trees in Lark Rise as they are too near the path and road. We are also removing a dead tree in the same road and seeking advice from tree surgeons on the two large trees at the end of the road near the bungalows and the footpath going on to the green.

The Land Committee is comprised of only two Directors at the moment and therefore requests to deal with certain issues around the Village sometimes have to wait for someone to be able to go out and have a look, contact various parties and then decide on the action to be taken. If you think things are taking too long to get done, perhaps you would like to volunteer to come on the Board and help out!

This month we would like to point out that the litter that is dropped around the Village is, to a great extent, being picked up by a

lovely chap who is paid from MHHL funds to do this. We mention this as some people wrongly think the Council does it and this is another example of how our maintenance charge is being used. (For info. the shopping centre is not the responsibility of MHHL).

Oliver and Robert Paul run the Suffolk Food Hall at Wherstead and we invited them to tell us about their family heritage and farmers markets. They explained how farming has changed since the war and how commercialisation has played a major part in this change. During the 70s and 80s farmers were encouraged to make too much food and were paid to grow crops such as linseed irrespective of the need and market for it. During this time traditional breeds of cattle and pigs were lost. Thankfully things today are changing and farmers are now looking at new ways to farm. At the food hall the staff endeavours to tell customers as much as they can about the food they are buying i.e. how it is reared/slaughtered. Apparently we eat a huge amount of pork including sausages and bacon in Suffolk. Apart from meat the Suffolk Food Hall sells a huge variety of food and although they struggle to find skilled labour such as fishmongers, butchers and chefs we

were delighted to hear that they encourage and teach young people to learn a trade. Some of us have already visited the food hall and certainly intend to return.
