MARTLESHAM MONTHLY MAMMALS

January:- Grey Squirrel (*Sciurus carolinensis*). A species which was introduced from North America in 1876 approximately to a number of sites, since then it has spread throughout the UK and indirectly affected the decline of the Red Squirrel. Grey Squirrels can live to approximately 6 years, many die in the first years of life as victims to vehicles, dogs and birds of prey. They build a drey made from stripped bark, moss and twigs which is like a nest built in the forks

of tree branches but can be found living in buildings. The squirrels can produce two litters a year, one in spring and another in summer months. A litter can have 1-7 young. They can be seen all months of the year but winter time they are seen on the woodland floor digging up food stashes which were hidden in autumn. Can be seen all over Martlesham where there are trees.

Suffolk Coastal Local Development Framework - Consultation on the Reviewed Draft Core Strategy

This significant planning consultation was issued on 29th November and the deadline for responses is **23rd January**. The most important issue for Martlesham is on housing. Housing numbers have been revised to some extent but there is no alteration to the proposals for 2,000 new homes on the land south of BT.

RECREATION & AMENITIES COMMITTEE

This article explains the work of the Recreation and Amenities Committee (R&A). It is responsible for allocating over 60% of the Parish income on land maintenance, footpath rights of way, recreation and play areas and amenities such as bus shelters, public seating, litter and fido bins. Within that fairly short list there are some very important and highly visible projects.

The R&A manages the Council's land maintenance contract which includes grass cutting of The Green, Martlesham Heath, and maintenance of other parish land assets, such as the Recreation Ground, Martlesham.

We look after 4 play areas: "Harry Higgins", beside the Pavilion; "Centenary", opposite Gorseland School; "Jubilee", off Carol Avenue; "Kronji's Piece", at the Recreation Ground. The Centenary Playspace is due to have a major facelift with the provision of new equipment specified by the young people themselves thanks to a project led by a local resident as part of an R&A working group.

The parish has a large number of permissive footpaths and a particularly good circular walk, details of which can be obtained from the circular walk information boards, our website and the Parish Office. We work with the County Council & landowners to maintain the paths.

The Common is designated a County Wildlife Site and is managed by the committee, with the help of the Greenways Project. Consideration is also being given to provision of a BMX track, and efforts are being made with MALGA to establish allotments.

The Portal Woodlands Conservation Group, a working group of the R&A, has achieved the Anglia in Bloom Best Conservation Project. Excellent work has been done by engaging young people in two projects: Nature Watch Club for 5 – 11 year olds covering wildlife education and Nature Explorers for

10 – 16 year olds giving practical conservation skills.

Working parties involve parishioners and councillors in clearing vegetation, managing our open spaces and litter picking.

This committee works hard to keep our local amenities in good order, maintain our open spaces and keep our environment special.

JOHN KELSO'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

Firstly may I wish everyone a happy new year and hope that you all had a good Christmas.

The Local Development Framework (LDF) Consultation

Hopefully most residents will now be aware that Suffolk Coastal is in the process of reviewing their LDF document and reconsidering the number of new houses to be built within the district. Unfortunately the new proposals are still requesting the provision of 2,000 new homes in the area adjacent to Adastral Park. The full document is available for viewing at www.suffolkcoastal.gov.uk/yourdistrict/planning/review. For those residents who do not have access to email the documents are available at Suffolk Coastal offices at Melton Hill Woodbridge or by prior arrangement with the Parish Clerk at the Parish Council Office at Felixstowe

Road. It is important to note that if you have responded to the previous consultation exercises it will be necessary for you to reiterate your comments again. **Please note that the final date for receipt of any consultation responses is 23rd January.**

Bloor Homes planning application

At the time of writing this report I have no further update as to when this application will be considered by the Suffolk Coastal Development Control Sub Committee. Officers are still awaiting responses from the developer to questions raised concerning certain aspects of the application.

Proposed mobile phone base station installation at Eagle Way

I have recently received correspondence from Babcock International Group acting on behalf of O2 and Vodaphone advising that they are in the process of identifying suitable sites within the Suffolk Coastal area to provide radio base stations. The site identified at Martlesham Heath is at Eagle Way near the footpath to Demesne Gardens opposite Carlford Close. The proposals include the erection of an 11.8m pole, cabinet and meter pillar. At the time of writing this report I am trying to ascertain the planning requirements for this equipment. I will be contacting those residents most directly affected.

CHRIS BLUNDELL'S DISTRICT COUNCILLOR REPORT

The Local Bus Service: I have now received more definitive information on the proposed revision of the local bus services to and from Martlesham and Martlesham Heath. It would appear that decisions are being taken primarily on economic factors. The 172/173 service is clearly very important to a number of our residents, unfortunately, there are insufficient users of the service

to justify it continuing to travel around Eagle Way. The service is set to continue but will only call in at the bus stop at the mini-roundabout opposite the BT entrance. In order to help make a case for keeping the full service I have placed a petition in Duncan's shop in the Square that I hope many users will sign. We have only got a few weeks until mid-January available to us to obtain sufficient signatures. Alternately you can e-mail the County Council Bus Transport department at smpt:david.gibbs@suffolk.gov.uk and give your views direct.

Local Development Framework:

There is only a short time left until 29th January for you to give your vote on the revised core strategy. It is worth noting that a new feature has appeared in the revised edition, namely that five 'Area Action Plans' (AAP) boundaries have been introduced. The one of most interest to us is that which covers Martlesham, Newbourne and Waldringfield. I shall take an interest in what these plans entail for the future.

The coming year 2011 is likely to see a number of new developments that I will be following closely and I trust and hope that they are to everyone's benefit and that everyone will have a successful and healthy new year. NANT UPDATE

Revised Planning Framework goes to public consultation

Suffolk Coastal District Council recently announced a review of the Local Development Framework (LDF). The revised document is currently out to public consultation for 8 weeks from 29th November to 23rd January. When approved, the LDF will set the planning policies for the whole District for the next 20 years.

A spokesperson from local

opposition group NANT (No Adastral New Town) commented "We are pleased that in the light of the new government's emerging planning policies, SCDC has announced that it has revisited some aspects of the Local Development Framework. Whilst welcoming this news, we think that allowing only 8 weeks, which includes the Christmas and New Year holiday period, is wholly inadequate. This vital consultation process will influence the framework for developments that will be here for generations to come. The council seems to be pressing ahead with undue haste, perhaps mindful that there is a council election next May. In addition, the coalition Government will soon be publishing details of its Localism Bill which promises more community involvement in development decisions affecting their area."

"Although the revised LDF shows a reduction of approximately 10% in the total number of houses needed across the district, it still includes a site specific allocation of 2000 houses at Adastral Park (the site of the BT planning application). It appears that the relevant policies in the LDF were written specifically to dovetail with BT's planning application. In other words we won't have a plan-led strategy (which is what we are supposed to have), we will have a BT-led strategy. If this version of the LDF is adopted by the council it will almost certainly lead to the approval of the BT application to build the new housing estate of 2000 houses and tower blocks.

The Government and SCDC have promised to attach great importance to the views of local people and grassroots organisations in the decision making process. It is hoped that SCDC Councillors and planning officers will live up to this promise and respond to the strength of feeling of local people when making important decisions on housing in the district, in the context of both the LDF Core Strategy (currently under review) and the BT planning application."

The public consultation period is the opportunity for the public and local communities to make their

comments directly to the council and to influence the decisions on the future character of this area. These views have to be fully taken into account before the matter goes for debate to a full council meeting.

Don't lose your democratic right to voice your opinion. Comment on the LDF and the future of our district. You must respond before January 23rd.

On the subject of the Western Corridor, we have word from Natural England that it is looking promising for government funding to maintain and improve this area. On the subject of a new name, we had one suggestion of "Sheep

Walks" or "The Walks", which was based on the history of the area. Any more suggestions?

There will be a Megabash on 19th February on the Western Corridor. This is organised by our local conservation group with Greenways and is to clear some of the gorse and trees from the Site of Special Scientific Interest. All are volunteers and anyone can join in. Drinks are usually provided but bring your own food. Stay as long as you like and do whatever you are capable of. All tools are provided by Greenways. Look out for signs giving more details.

A tree surgeon has been given the go ahead to deal with several trees around the heath, either for crown lifting, removal or pruning. Also the pathway between Manor Road and Carlford, to the north of the North Green, will have the vegetation cut back from the path, making access better for disabled vehicles as well as walkers. The weather has had an impact on starting this work. Our next meeting in St Michael's Church Centre is on 20th December at 7:30 pm.

MARTLESHAM MOTHERS' UNION

Each week in the Mothers' Union Prayer Diary, we are given a short report on countries with membership in the MU. Lesotho is one such country. It is surrounded by South Africa, and relies heavily on that country for job opportunities. Many of Lesotho's villages are only accessible by foot, horseback or light aircraft. Resources are scarce, partly a consequence of the limited space for agricultural development. Mothers' Union is helping to find work locally, manufacturing chairs, rearing pigs, sewing and planting trees. Members are also working to tackle the

domestic violence and abuse which affects many of the countries women and children. This is the Mothers' union at work worldwide. Why not join us at one of our meetings and find out what is happening locally?

"The heart of the matter!"

It is salutary, from time to time, to set down clearly, the essentials of the Christian Gospel. The Apostle Paul's testimony furnishes a good example. He was a zealous keeper of the Law, an Israelite through and through and he lived a strict way of righteousness. When he became a Christian he concludes - "All my past achievements, in my desire to become righteous before God, I now count as nothing! - I have gained Jesus Christ, and now have a righteousness of my own, not through my own efforts, but that which comes from faith in Christ" (Phil. Ch 3). Paul expands on this in his letter to the Romans. We are justified freely by God's grace through the redemption that came by Jesus Christ. God presented Him as a sacrifice of atonement, through faith in His blood.

The prisoner in the dock, who is pardoned by the Judge, because someone has paid his debt, goes on his way rejoicing, full of gratitude to his benefactor. So may we, when we understand all that God has done in Christ to deal with the debts of all our weaknesses.
